

AAPI votes may swing the nation on November 5

Early voting starts on October 26, and the stakes have never been higher. The surprise ticket of Vice President Kamala Harris and Gov. Tim Walz has re-energized Democrats, giving democracy and the rule of law a whisker of a chance against <u>barefaced authoritarianism</u> and the whims of a spiteful <u>felon</u>. However, the odds are still terrifyingly even.

In 2020, <u>7.6 million AAPI voters turned out</u>, including enough crucial votes in Georgia to bring victory to President Biden. In 2024, about <u>15 million Asian</u> <u>Americans are eligible to vote</u>, a 15% increase from 2020. We have substantial and growing populations in swing states and AAPI registration in 2024 increased by 43% over 2020, the largest percentage increase of any racial group. Can AAPI be the margin of victory again?

Will this be the year the US elects our first Asian American president?


HOW TO TAKE ACTION

WE MUST TAKE BACK THE HOUSE

MAKE CALLS AND KNOCK ON DOORS FOR KAMALA

<u>Sign up to make calls to AAPI</u> eligible to vote in a swing state. If you speak an Asian language, even better! According to <u>Sister District</u>, the following states are critical:

- Arizona, Georgia, Michigan, Nevada, New Hampshire, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin presidential swing states that also include additional target federal or state-level races.
- Montana and Ohio— are states key to a U.S. Senate majority.
- California and New York—states key to a U.S. House majority

USE YOUR NETWORKS

Friends and family who live in swing districts: Encourage them to hold Meet and Greets for local Democratic candidates, put up lawn signs, and invite candidates to local events.

Friends in **red districts**: Help them connect with other blue voters and <u>find local actions</u>.

Friends in **safe blue districts**: Connect them with groups like <u>Indivisible</u>, <u>Swing Left</u>, or <u>Sister</u> <u>District</u> to write postcards, make donations, travel to canvass, register voters, and network to win over MAGA Republicans up and down the ballot.



WHAT'S NEXT FOR THE AAPI CURRICULUM BILL

<u>Senate Bill S5963A</u>, which requires the Commissioner of Education to establish AANHPI history and civic impact curriculum or instructions for school districts, cleared the Senate in the 2023-24 legislative session!

Thank you to State Senator John C. Liu for sponsoring the bill, and to our State Senators Andrea Stewart-Cousins, Shelley Mayer and Pete Harckham for their invaluable support! The Assembly version_A6579A, sponsored by Assembly Member Grace Lee (D) and cosponsored by Westchester Assembly Members Chris Burdick and Mary Jane Shimsky (thank you!), did not pass and remains in Committee. Both bills need to be re-introduced in the 2024-25 legislative session. Advocacy groups are gearing up for an expanded push with New York state's growing AANHPI coalition. To join advocacy efforts and join the REACH Coalition (WAAD is a member) go here.

- Ask your local school parents, teachers, PTSA, school board, and superintendent to support the bill

WHY YOU SHOULD VOTE "YES" ON PROPOSITION 1

New York's State Constitution currently includes protections for race and religion, but this amendment — <u>Prop 1</u> — would close those loopholes by prohibiting government discrimination based on a person's ethnicity, national origin, age, disability, and sex—including LGBT, pregnancy, and abortion rights. Proposal 1 came about largely in response to state governments and courts across the county rolling back fundamental rights and banning abortions, and is supported by a large and growing NYS-wide <u>coalition</u>. **Turn over the ballot and vote YES ON PROPOSITION 1.**

AAPI Summit in Albany

The 1st Annual AAPI Summit of NY was held on May 9, 2024. The Summit, organized by the New York State Assembly Asian Pacific American Task Force, featured several workshops hosted by various elected officials. Assemblymember Chris Burdick hosted a panel, "Social Isolationism in the AAPI Community," which was put together with help from his Chief of Staff and WAAD Co-Chair Heather Mieko Lackey. WAAD was also well represented by WAAD vice chairs Dr. Bhavana Pahwa and Westchester County Legislator David Imamura. The event drew more than 300 Asian Americans from across New York State to discuss and advocate for solutions to various issues impacting our communities.

\$30 million from the State for New York's AAPI communities!

After months of advocacy by the over 130 AAPI-led and -serving community-based organizations (including WAAD) that make up New York's AAPI Equity Budget Coalition, the historic \$30 million of NY State funding to our AAPI communities was restored in the 2024-25 State Budget!
